



Articles of a Treaty made and concluded, and, between Lieutenant General Andrew H. Searman, General William S. Harney, General George H. Terry, General G. B. Angus, J. D. Breckinridge, Nathaniel G. Taylor, John B. Harlow and Samuel F. Tappan, duly appointed Commissioners on the part of the United States and the different Bands of the Great Nation of Indians whose names and their chiefs and head men whose names are hereunto subscribed, they being duly authorized to act in the premises.

Article I. From this day forward, all animosity between the parties to this agreement shall forever cease. The Government of the United States desires peace and wishes to hereby pledge to keep it. The Indians desire peace and they now pledge their honor and manhood to keep it. All bad men among the whites and among the people, subject to the authority of the United States, who commit any wrong upon the person or property of the Indians, will be punished, and it shall be the duty of the Agent, or of the Commissioner or of the Officer at Washington City, to inquire into and cause the offenders to be arrested and punished according to the laws of the United States and also to pay for the injury sustained for the loss sustained.

If bad men among the Indians should commit a wrong or depredation upon the person or property of any white, black or Indian, subject to the authority of the United States, the Indians herein named, solemnly agree that they
